Grey District Council - May 2024



Since my last newsletter comment, Coast leaders have been very lucky to have had frequent opportunities to engage with Minister Shane Jones and our West Coast representative MP Maureen Pugh.

Discussion has focused on the briefing to the incoming Government that West Coast Mayors, Chairs and Iwi prepared with the aim of elevating development throughout the region.

Minister Jones attended the February opening of the Pike 29 Track and there was an opportunity to show him the development around our port which was made possible by funding received from the Government's Provincial Growth Fund. The Minister also visited the new Pounamu Pathway cultural experience centre and he was most impressed with both this and the port development. Since then, we have had opportunities to provide information as an aligned group of leaders on what economic development and resilience we need going forward. From these interactions the Minister has requested more information on:

- Upgrading the regional airports
- Waiho River Franz Josef Flood **Protection Work**
- Waitaha Hydro Scheme
- Westport's Flood Resilience
- Spring Creek Mine
- **Greymouth Ports**

The information requested has been provided and from the engagement we have had, we're very optimistic these projects that are imperative for our region to thrive and be resilient will be considered for funding opportunities arising in the future. Some of these projects do not even require funding. The Waitaha Scheme and Spring Creek Mine, for example, would both be privately funded. The latter would provide approximately 60 jobs and upwards of \$7.5 million in wages to the West Coast economy. The mine is predicted to produce 200,000 tonnes of internationally rare coal into the specialist coal market targeted at the high value silicon metal industry for use in a variety of products, such as solar panels. If this mine is to reopen it has little to no effect on the environment with infrastructure already in place. There are also various other rare mineral projects being considered on the West Coast including minerals that are needed for components of technologies we all need and use. I'm pleased to say confidence in investment in this sector is also increasing.

We still require housing and both

house prices and confidence in the district have risen substantially. We want to assure investors, developers and the construction sector that the future is looking bright and although all sectors of housing are in need, they have a great part to play in the skilled worker and aging sector of new housing development. Kāinga Ora is working on many housing projects in the social sector which is good to see. Commercial building and our CBD is also at the biggest turning point we have seen in a long time with more buildings and businesses in the planning stages which makes for a very busy sector. There is lots of growth, business projects in the planning, the mineral sector opening but along with all these great positives comes hurdles and problems to overcome. Overall the positivity of the future is looking good, and we will work through whatever pops up as we go along together.

DOG REGISTRATION

A reminder to all Grey District residents that dog registration notices for the 24/25 year will be mailed out to dog owners by the end of June and will be due for payment by 31 July 2024.

We are unable to accept payments until 01 July 2024. Unpaid registration fees will incur a late payment penalty from 01 August 2024.

All dogs must be registered by the time they are three months of age, and this must be renewed every year thereafter.

If you have a new dog and we don't know about it, please contact us to start the registration process.

If you have moved here from a different district let us know and we will do a district changeover at no extra cost.


While you are required to register your dogs by law, your registration fee helps contribute to a range of benefits that we all get to enjoy as residents in the district.

- · Providing an after hours (emergency only) service
- · Educating owners and promoting better care and welfare of dogs
- Administration of the Dog Control Act 1996 and Council Bylaws
