

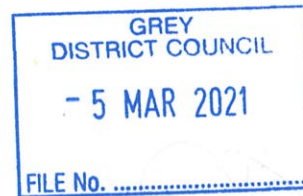

## RE: New Zealand Museum & Visitor Centre, Le Quesnoy, France

Following on from my presentation to the Rural and Provincial Sector meeting in Wellington late last year, I would like to take this opportunity to reinforce the importance of the Le Quesnoy museum project to our country and to the memory of our soldiers, who fought and perished on the battlefields of Europe in two World Wars.

The achievement of our troops in liberating the town of Le Quesnoy just one week before the end of the First World War is one of true Kiwi courage and ingenuity. It is also a testament to their dedication and sacrifice. The opportunity we have through the Museum & Visitor Centre project to tell this story means that we can look back, remember and reflect on the events of the past but also look forward and consider how we might ensure war can be avoided in the future.

Our project continues to move forward. We are working closely with the French government on the project and are currently having discussions about a potential partnership. We have also been successful in the last six months with our New Zealand fundraising effort from private donors. This is despite the challenges that Covid-19 has thrown at us all in 2020.

As mentioned in my presentation, we have recently approved the Internal Experience Design Brief for the Museum & Visitor Centre prepared by New Zealand museum experts Lily Frederikse, Tim Walker and Karl Johnstone. The Feasibility Study prepared by French company, Lamaya, was signed off last year and our Māori Advisory Group has provided a Māori cultural framework to inform the overall visitor experience.


In short, we are in a good position to proceed with the project's initiation in 2021.

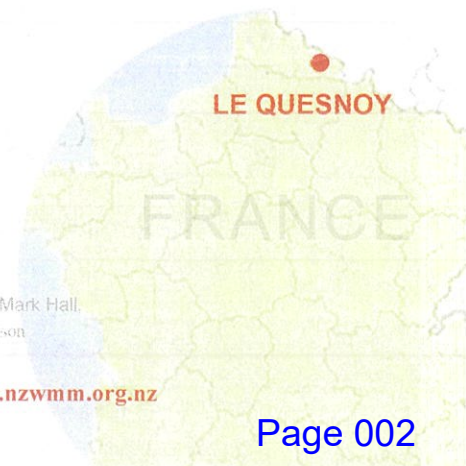

Private swim school lessons - proposed price increase of 14.3% to \$24 an hour.

We have a disabled son who needs private lessons. We are currently paying \$21 for a lesson that lasts 20 mins, and this looks set to rise to \$24 a lesson. That would bring the cost to \$1.20 a minute. Or close to \$1000 a year.

Our rates are also going to rise by close to \$300 a year.

Combined with the swim fee increase, we will be paying about \$9 more a week.

Many children doing private lessons are disabled. Households with a disabled child rarely have two full time working parents, and are already under financial pressure.

## Submissions (Not speaking) LTP 2021-2031

A quick check of South Island swim schools shows \$24 is by far at the steeper end.

We would urge you to reconsider this increase; or create a special category for disabled children.

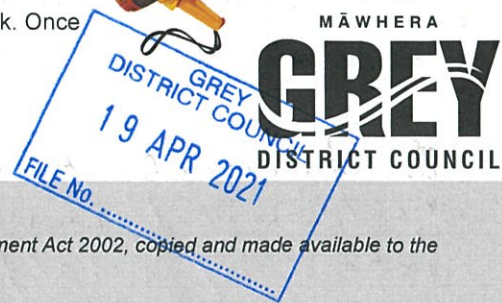

### **About Hospitality New Zealand:**

1. Hospitality New Zealand (“Hospitality NZ”) is a member-led, not-for-profit organisation representing approximately 3,000 businesses, including cafés, restaurants, bars, nightclubs, commercial accommodation, country hotels and off-licences.
2. Hospitality NZ has a 119-year history of advocating on behalf of the hospitality and tourism sector and is led by Chief Executive Julie White. We have a team of seven Regional Managers located around the country, and a National Office in Wellington to service our members.
3. Hospitality NZ has a Board of Management, made up of elected members from across the sectors of the industry, and an Accommodation Advisory Council, made up of elected members from the accommodation sector.
4. We also have 20 local Branches covering the entire country, representing at a local level all those member businesses which are located within the region. Any current financial member of Hospitality NZ is automatically a member of the local Branch.
5. This submission relates to the Long-Term Plan 2021-31 (“the Plan”).

### **SPECIFIC COMMENTS:**

#### **RATES**

7. The tourism and hospitality industries been among the hardest hit sectors by the Covid -19 pandemic and are still struggling to survive. Hospitality and commercial accommodation venues are closing throughout the region, due to the uncertainty of the ongoing situation, and have the stress to try and keep people employed sitting squarely on their shoulders.
8. Hospitality NZ urges caution around rates increases. We do understand the importance of the revenue that rates generate to Council, which enables service delivery, community projects, planned programmes and daily operations. We do not think that businesses should carry an unfair proportion of the rates bill.
9. We recommend that instead of continually looking got increase rates and placing burdens on the already struggling rate payers, why does the council not look at other possible funding/revenue sources?
10. The significant growth in short-term rental accommodation (STRA) through providers such as AirBnB or Bookabach, operate in a highly commercial way, yet these properties pay residential rates.
11. Hospitality NZ contends that in the interests of fairness, equity and user pays, that Airbnb hosts, or similar, who are operating in the District should be rated accordingly, and also be subject to regulatory requirements.

12. STRA operators do not require the same building and operational compliance as commercial accommodation providers do, and therefore do not attract the associated costs that commercial accommodation providers do. **By placing the relevant compliance costs and rates upon STRA would generate additional revenue for Grey Council.**
13. STRA operators also have an impact on the communities they operate in, contributing to housing shortages, noise impacts and loss of community.
14. We propose that where premises are operating as a business they should be treated as such.
15. Many councils around the country have already identified these issues and are imposing appropriate rates on STRA providers, or at the very minimum, inserting an online registration fees on these businesses.

### **General Comments:**

16. Hospitality New Zealand welcomes the opportunity to comment on the Grey District Council's Long-Term Plan 2021-31. We have a number of general concerns on issues that we believe will rear their head in the next ten years. These include infrastructure funding, local alcohol policies, short-term rental accommodation, and responsible camping.

### **Infrastructure Funding**

17. Local Councils in some parts of the country have recognised infrastructure funding is a significant issue and are working towards change, some Councils are looking at targeted rates while others have openly criticised the funding investment options put forward by the Government.
18. In 2019, Productivity Commission undertook its report into Local Government Funding and Finance. The report recommended that "Better use of existing tools and central government funds should be enough to close the tourism funding shortfall. Given the small scale of the funding gap, introducing new funding tools would incur significant implementation, administration and enforcement costs and is unlikely to result in a net benefit to councils."
19. We endorse those sentiments - rather than introducing new tools that target specific sectors, councils should make better use of existing tools to achieve their goals.
20. Hospitality NZ believes a consistent and fair nationwide approach to the funding of core infrastructure needs to be introduced.
21. Hospitality and accommodation sectors are viewed by local councils as an easy source of funds, via targeted rates on commercial businesses, or implementing bed taxes. Hospitality NZ opposes the introduction of bed tax as it targets only those people staying in commercial accommodation.
22. If a targeted rate or visitor levy is deemed necessary, Hospitality NZ believes these must be broad based taxes, and ensure that they are appropriately designed, are fair and equitable to those contributing, have community support, and are used solely for

initiatives that benefit the visitor economy. Alternatively, those funds raised must be ring-fenced and used for the benefit of those contributing to the fund. However, Hospitality NZ's preference would be for any funding of tourism infrastructure to come from a centralised pool.

23. Hospitality NZ recommends further consideration is given to implement the Productivity Commission's report findings.
24. Prior to COVID, tourism was struggling to maintain social license in communities - in part given the infrastructure pressure tourism growth was placing on some regions. We recognise that tourism and hospitality use and benefit from a wide variety of mixed-use infrastructure. We now have a real opportunity to resolve some of these infrastructure issues and prepare for the rebuild of the sector.
25. Targeted rates and 'tourism' or 'bed taxes' concern our members, who assert:
  - These unfairly place the burden of funding infrastructure or promotion on just one part of the tourism/hospitality industry;
  - As ratepayers, businesses oppose increased rates to fund basic infrastructure they may not receive a direct benefit from i.e., infrastructure for freedom campers;
  - We would prefer to see Central Government funding of infrastructure, where local councils are unable to fund it themselves; and
  - If new funding schemes are required, there needs to be an emphasis on broad-based levying. They need to be fair and equitable and all businesses who will benefit from further infrastructure development should contribute.

### Local Alcohol Policies (LAPs)

26. Hospitality NZ has and continues to be actively involved in developing LAPs, ensuring the sector, local communities and the viability of our members have the best fit settings and rules governing the sale and consumption of alcohol.
27. Hospitality NZ has actively contributed by submitting on all draft LAPs throughout the country. Some Councils have opted not to introduce a LAP and instead used the national default rules set out in the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (SSAA).
28. Since the implementation of SSAA 2012 Act it has become apparent that some Councils often attempt to include rules within an LAP that are beyond their authority. This is a timely and expensive process.
29. The wider hospitality industry would like the process of LAPs to be either repealed or significantly amended.
30. Within the current District Licencing Committees system, there is the ability for each licence to have appropriate restrictions placed on it if deemed necessary by the committee. A shift in the system whereby DLCs administer appropriate restrictions would render the LAP process unnecessary.

### Short-term Rental Accommodation (STRA)

31. Traditional accommodation operators are seeking a fairer playing field with regard to commercial vs non-commercial rates and regulation. STRA operators do not require the

same building and operational compliance and therefore do not attract the associated costs that commercial accommodation providers do. However, they do benefit from things like tourism promotion which is often funded from the tourism and accommodation sector. STRA operators also have an impact on the communities they operate in, contributing to housing shortages, noise impacts and loss of community.

32. There is a growing inequity in the regulation of short-term and long-term accommodation. Stats NZ estimated that for 2018, STRA gross revenue was between \$550-\$700 million, with guest nights between 6-10 million.
33. The STRA sector operates mainly in residential areas, only pays residential rates, operates with less regulation, and often escapes appropriate taxation. Where councils have tried to regulate STRA operators, barriers for regulation include identification of STRA properties, lack of cooperation in data capture from operators and booking platform providers, and consistent regulation between local councils.
34. As more people look to non-traditional STRA, safety standards, hygiene standards, and contact tracing becomes significant guest care factors and priorities post-COVID-19. We face negative impacts of an unregulated and substandard product offered to both local and international visitors.
35. Hospitality NZ alongside other sector associations submitted a letter to MBIE in July 2020 recommending a compulsory registration/data sharing system that allows for information collection from all operators of STRA and a consistent national regulatory framework.
36. Hospitality NZ would welcome the opportunity to work with you and related parties to:
  - Define commercial accommodation in your area in a way that captures people who are benefiting from STRA house letting on a commercial level;
  - Ensure rates are appropriately collected from these businesses;
  - Ensure appropriate health and safety and compliance requirements on peer-to-peer house letting is set at a national level, removing the need for local councils to come up with the rules; and
  - Advocate to Central Government to create a national register of short-term rental accommodation properties, moving towards fair regulation of STRA operators.

### **Responsible Camping**

37. Freedom camping has been a part of New Zealand culture for many years. However, in recent years, freedom camping has attracted more attention as international tourism numbers have grown, and communities have expected higher standards from both domestic and international tourists. The proliferation of non-self-contained freedom campers parking up in non-compliant spots around the country has increased to the detriment of local's perception of visitors, the environment and to other visitors using these facilities.
38. The number of international visitors who did some freedom camping in New Zealand has been rising recently, from 54,000 in the year ended 2013 to around 123,000 in the year ended 2018. This followed a period of moderate growth from around 10,000 visitors at the beginning of the 2000's. Total estimated spending by visitors who did some freedom camping has also increased significantly in this period, from \$210 million in 2013 to \$540 million in 2018. The growth in numbers and spending from this group of visitors followed a similar pattern to that seen for total international visitors. However,

even with this increase, only 3.4 per cent of visitors to New Zealand did some freedom camping in 2017 and 2018.

39. The definition of "self-contained" now means freedom campers wanting to stay in restricted areas will need a toilet that can be used inside the vehicle even when the bed is made up.
40. The wider industry feels their local councils need to do more to control this issue and are also concerned about the damage being done to scenic spots due to lack of appropriate facilities. When left unmanaged it effects the amenity of an area negatively through rubbish, waste and congestion in public areas.
41. Direct effects can be seen on smaller accommodation providers where freedom campers have the ability to stay in areas where no clear local rules have been established. Therefore, having the ability to stay centrally in their vehicles as opposed to staying at small to medium sized accommodation.
42. The Tourism Infrastructure Fund put public bathrooms in many popular tourism spots, and unintentionally created places where people could freedom camp - some of which were only a few kilometres from a holiday park. We do not believe this contributes to the type of high value visitor we want.
43. Businesses primarily impacted are holiday parks as these freedom campers would traditionally have stayed in these facilities. Currently issues for holiday parks include freedom campers using facilities without paying.
44. Hospitality New Zealand wants local government to develop and strengthen appropriate regulations for responsible camping, and create infrastructure cost support for the future.
45. Hospitality NZ would welcome the opportunity to work with you and related parties to:
  - Take greater leadership in managing the locations where freedom campers can operate;
  - Implement freedom camping bylaws through clear, honest, pragmatic consultation and feedback during its development; and
  - Lobby to ensure Central Government has a strategy to acknowledge the growth in freedom camping - accommodating responsible camping but not to the detriment of other visitor experiences and other accommodation providers (i.e., Motels and Holiday parks).

### **Conclusion:**

46. We thank the Grey District Council for the opportunity to provide input into the consultation.





## Playground shade summary for Grey District

In 2017, a nationwide survey was conducted of playground shade across the country using Google Earth and Google Street View images. The research aimed to identify the extent of playground shade in each territorial local authority (TLA) and examples of best practice. This report summarises the findings for this particular TLA, and how its playgrounds compare with other parts of New Zealand.

### **The importance of shade**

Skin cancer is the most common cancer in New Zealand, but is highly preventable. Up to 90% of melanoma and 95% of non-melanoma skin cancers are caused by excessive exposure to ultraviolet radiation (UVR). The provision of effective shade helps to reduce this harm. The planting of trees can also help to reduce climate change and prevent soil erosion. As trees grow, they absorb carbon dioxide and release oxygen into the atmosphere.

Shade is particularly important when designing and upgrading playgrounds. The Local Government Act 2002 highlights the need for a healthy and safe environments, both now and in the future. A 2013 survey found that 78% of NZ adults ‘strongly agreed’ or ‘somewhat agreed’ that their council should use money from rates to provide shade in public places.<sup>1</sup> Additionally, 65% said they would pay \$10 extra per annum to see more shade in public spaces, with 55% saying they would pay \$30 extra.

### **Sampling frame and method**

A sample of one playground per 10,000 population was selected from each TLA, with a minimum target sample of five playgrounds per TLA (where available). This resulted in a sample of 559 playgrounds nationwide, including five from Grey District.

For each playground, we estimated the amount of shade covering: main play structures (e.g. series of play equipment, stand-alone play equipment (e.g. swing sets) and sitting/eating areas.

We also identified the proportion of playgrounds that had shade within 10m of any playground equipment. Shade coverage estimates were made using Google Earth satellite and Street View images. To ensure consistency, estimates were made based on shadow patterns expected at solar noon on the summer solstice (approximately 1.30pm on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of December).

## **Key findings: Nationwide sample**

### *New Zealand playgrounds have limited shade*

Of the 559 playgrounds sampled, only 44% had at least one source of shade covering playground activity areas (equipment, seats or tables). Only 14.1% of playground activity (449/ 2896) had at least some shade cover. This contrasts to 84% of activity areas in high-income Sydney playgrounds and 46% in low-income Sydney playgrounds. This is of particular concern as New Zealand and Australia have the highest rates of melanoma in the world. Australia's whole-of society approach to sun protection, including shade provision, is having a positive impact on their younger age group.

### *Playgrounds in low-income areas in New Zealand have less shade*

Playgrounds from more deprived neighbourhoods were 41% less likely to have at least one source of shade than the least deprived (wealthier) neighbourhoods

### *Most shade came from trees*

Trees accounted for 82.3% of playground shade. Purpose-built shade structures (e.g. shade sails) were rare, but more common in some TLA's such as Whangarei. Examples of good shading practices can be found on page 5.

### *Most playgrounds have shade nearby*

77% of playgrounds had at least one source of shade within 10m of play equipment. However, this shade offers no cover for users of playground equipment and rarely covered seats/tables or areas where people gather.

### *Few councils have sun protection policies*

Incorporating shade in long-term and district plans can help ensure that shade is considered and provided. Excluding regional councils, we were only able to identify five district councils that had sun protection policies (or equivalents) on their website (New Plymouth District Council, Napier City Council, Whangarei District Council, Palmerston North City Council and Horowhenua District Council).

The Grey District Council can contribute to reducing the skin cancer burden for New Zealand by including ample shade in all areas, parks and playgrounds where residents and visitors to the Grey District will be encouraged and welcomed to participate in community life.

Any areas in the Grey District, where the residents and visitors may be spending considerable time outdoors - a significant proportion of which would be in the peak UV times (times when the UV index level is 3 and above - namely Sept-April 10am-4pm) we would ask that council consider giving due consideration to providing shade when designing any new and / or upgrading any existing outdoor spaces, particularly parks, playgrounds and picnic seating areas.

Skin cancer is the most common cancer in New Zealand, but it is highly preventable. Almost 90% of melanoma and 95% of non-melanoma skin cancers are caused by excessive exposure to ultraviolet radiation. Council can, in including ample shade in any new developments and upgrades of existing facilities.

A nationwide survey\* was conducted of playground shade across New Zealand. Of the 559 playgrounds sampled only 44% had at least one source of shade covering playground activity areas (equipment, seats or tables). Only 14% of playground activity had at least some cover. A key finding from the survey was that few councils have sun protection policies and that by incorporating shade in long term and district plans can help ensure that shade is considered and provided to benefit all residents and visitors alike. New developments outlined in the LTP further extend the scope for shade consideration and provision.

New centres like the Library Project could consider the use of shade awnings or shade provision (whether natural or built shade) for outdoor seating and spaces where people may congregate. Consideration of shade should be an integral aspect of all outdoor sport and recreation facility development under council control.

*"We will continue to provide community facilities that enhance the wellbeing and connectedness of our community and these include retirement housing units, library, recreation facilities and events for the community to participate in."*

Whilst personal sun protection is important, environmental changes through the provision of shade offers a more effective to prevent against over-exposure to UVR. A one-off cost at construction can ensure that shade is provided through either natural means (ie: shade trees) and/or well-designed built structures, thereby providing practical strategies to minimise UV harm and enhance enjoyment of the community.

The Cancer Society therefore requests that shade be considered as a positive and safe enhancement to any new developments and enhancement projects outlined for the Grey District over the next 10 years.

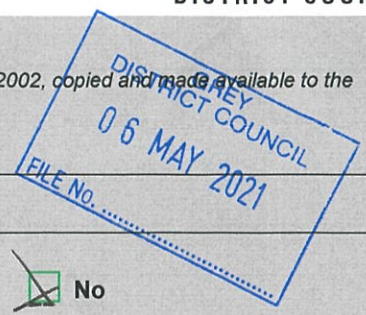

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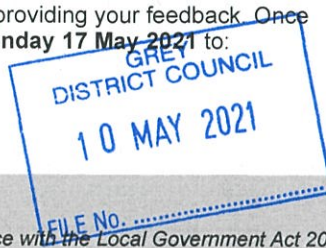

**Submission to the Grey District Council Long Term Plan – 2021-2031**

**Upgrade to Rooding at the Eastern End of Koe Street, Moana**

We are writing in support of the submission made by Tim and Robin Gwatkin, requesting that the Grey District Council upgrades the rooding at the eastern end of Koe Street, Moana.

We are the owners of the property at 66 - 70 Koe Street, Moana.

Koe Street, to the east of Kehu Street, is a no exit street. The seal at the eastern end of Koe Street finishes about 57m from the end of the road reserve. The formed road ends about 8m from the end of the seal. A kerb extends along from the end of the seal on the south side of the road for about 10m. There is no provision for vehicle turning at the end of the no exit street.

It is not uncommon for vehicles looking for lake access to drive down the street and enter the properties then needing to turn around in driveways.

Stormwater runoff from the road/road reserve has entered the properties on the southern side of the road.

The western end of Koe Street, also no exit, has a formed cul de sac offset turning head for vehicle manoeuvring.

There is an area of about 855m<sup>2</sup> of road reserve from the end of the seal that is largely unmaintained by the council with the expectation that the adjacent landowners will maintain the area. The bank area was cleared of gorse and scrub about 2 years ago by the council at our request but no other maintenance appears to have been completed. Within this area is a culvert about 15m from the end of the road reserve that discharges into an open drain. The invert of the drain is about 2m below the formed access level at the culvert. The water flow is undercutting the bank that will likely cause collapse at some time.

To extend the sealed road to close to the end of the road reserve would be relatively costly due to the elevation change across the area and with the presence of the culvert and open drain. A more pragmatic approach, and one that is being proposed, is for a cul de sac offset turning head to be formed, extending the sealed area by only 10-12m, with vehicle crossings and suitable drainage being provided.

We also propose that the council undertakes maintenance to the open drain, removes existing trees and provides suitable planting to the southern side of the open drain, within the road reserve, to make maintaining the area easier.
