## **Mayor's Comment**

I hope you all had a great Christmas and New Year and took some time out for the holiday season. Now that we're back into it, there are busy times ahead. Council is working on its Long-Term Plan (LTP) which is always a massive task. This time around will be one of the hardest we have faced.

The Government's 100-day plan will see the repeal of significant legislation such as Three Waters. We await clarity around how this will impact our LTP and details of the Government's intentions for any proposed replacement. Along with repeals of the new Resource Management legislation, National Policy Statement for Indigenous Biodiversity and Speed Limits, there are a few examples of the changes this Government is winding back. We do, however, wholeheartedly support these changes and appreciate the speed at which they are being made.

We're hopeful that comments made by Government about the National Policy

Statement for Indigenous Biodiversity will mean landowners will not be threatened with more restrictions on their private land. There's also positive talk about mining and stewardship land, indicating potential for opportunities on the West Coast to now get the go ahead, creating more economic opportunities and higher paying employment across the region. The country needs our rare earth minerals for new green technologies and on the West Coast we promote ethical mining done well.

West Coast Mayors, Chairs and Iwi has produced a briefing to the incoming Government. This includes proposals




and opportunities that are merely policy adjustments for the Government. These adjustments will cost little and, in many instances, if they free up potential mining opportunities, will generate significant royalties. This could benefit our region and contribute towards the Government improving its fiscal position.

The Group has not asked for handouts. It is seeking permission to 'let us do it for ourselves'. Even the Waitaha will not cost ratepayers or taxpayers a cent but will build economic resilience on the Coast.

There are common themes shared with the rest of the country in areas such as roading, regional resilience, housing and in parts of the Three Waters. Each district has different levels of assistance needed but we are working together as a region to show unity and one voice, and we've aligned our proposal on the most important issues we face.

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## Community **funding**

The Grey District Council administers the following funding schemes that are available at various times throughout the year to groups in our community: Contestable Grant Fund, **Creative Communities New Zealand Scheme and Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund.** 

Please refer to our website to view the details and the remaining application openings for all funding opportunities.

### **Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund**

Applications for round two 2023/2024 will open on Monday 1st April 2024 and closes Tuesday 30th April 2024. (round one 2024/2025 will open on Monday 2nd October 2024). Full details can be found on our website or at Council Office.

The fund helps to lower travel barriers for rural sport clubs and school teams where players aged between 5 and 19 years require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions.

Sport NZ's Rural Travel Fund (RTF) supports young people to take part in regular sporting activities through clubs and schools. School club teams and sport club teams are defined as:

- A school club team participating in regular local sport competition in weekends, that excludes interschool and intraschool competitions played during school time.
- A sports club team participating in organised, regular sport competition through club membership outside of school time.

Recent recipients were: Cobden Kohinoor Rugby League, Greymouth Junior Athletics Club, West Coast Cricket and Greymouth Marist Rugby Club.



## **Creative Communities New Zealand Scheme**

Funding Round Two of The 2023 -2024 Creative Communities Fund will open Monday 1st April 2024 and close Tuesday 30th April 2024. Full details can be found on our website or at Council Office.

The scheme supports and encourages communities throughout New Zealand to create and present diverse opportunities for accessing and participating in local arts activities. All projects eligible for funding must be arts and cultural projects that:

- Increase participation in the arts at a local level or increase the range and diversity of the arts available to local communities;
- Take place within the Grey District and/or produce benefits that are largely experienced within the Grey District; and
- Benefit local communities.

Recent recipients have been: Pou Mahi a Iwi Cultural Work Centre Trust, Te Puawai Co-operative Society Ltd, The West Coast Society of Arts Collections & Connections, SuperBrain ProductioNZ Ltd, Greymouth Operatic Society, Heather Milne,

### **One Off Festival Funding**

In 2023/24 we also have a one-off funding amount from Creative NZ to support established festivals that celebrate life experiences, stories, cultures, and regional identities of New Zealanders, which continue to be impacted by the effects of COVID-19.

Note: Applicants can apply for EITHER a Creative Communities Scheme OR a Festival Fund grant for your festival. Please check the criteria on our website to see what applies for your situation.

## What is Mayors Taskforce for Jobs?

The Mayors Taskforce for Jobs (MTFJ) is a community employment programme that supports NEETS (young people aged 16-24 not in education, training or employment), people living with a disability or people who are disadvantaged in the workforce.

The programme has funding available to support jobseekers to become work ready, providing support to secure sustainable employment within the Grey District.

Our team works with jobseekers to create a specific plan to support their goals and aspirations for their future. Each jobseeker's situation is unique, so our team uses a tailored approach to suit each jobseeker's situation.

#### **What can Mayors Taskforce** for Jobs offer?

Some examples where Mayors Taskforce for Jobs can support a jobseeker into employment:

- CV preparation
- Purchasing tools or equipment
- Purchasing Personal Protective Equipment
- Covering the cost of training and courses
- Offering travel and accommodation assistance
- Covering the cost of driver licensing
- Offering pastoral care support
- Offering a Wage Subsidy to the employer

#### You can now use Snap Send Solve to report issues directly to Grey District Council!

The Snap Send Solve app helps you to report things like dumped rubbish, footpath problems, water leaks and other issues in seconds.

There are just four simple steps:

- Take a picture of the issue (this is optional)
- Confirm the location of the issue
- Select the type of issue (Snap, Send, Solve uses the location and type of issue to send the report to the correct authority).
- Fill out the details on the form and press "submit".

That's it. We'll get onto the issue and let you know what we've done.
