Mayors Comment

November is already here, and we're fast approaching another busy Christmas and holiday season! It's wonderful to be attending events and witnessing and observing the big changes in our CBD.

In December, Pounamu Pathways, a new tourism initiative, will open. Pounamu Pathways uses technology created by Weta Workshops in collaboration with Poutini Ngāi Tahu, to tell the story of the ancient routes of pounamu traders and warriors along the West Coast. This initiative will enhance our region's economic growth by providing an anchor point for visitors disembarking the Tranz Alpine, encouraging them to stay longer on the West Coast. The Greymouth site will serve as the central hub, connecting visitors and locals to the historical journey from Haast to Westport, showcasing our rich history. I'm eager to see the effect of this fantastic new attraction on visitor numbers.

Recent developments include the construction of new retail premises for Noel Leeming and some Town Centre sites that were in disrepair earmarked for demolition. While it's sad to see buildings that have served our town for many years disappear, safety and economic viability require these tough decisions to pave the way for progress. Progress creates new opportunities for the future, instils confidence in businesses and communities, and further establishes Grey District as an attractive place to live, work and play.

To further this quest, we are excited to embark on the development of our new library complex, located on a freehold site at the intersection of Boundary Street and Richmond Quay. Council is collaborating with Development West Coast to deliver this facility that is set to be an attractive destination for all. The complex will feature commercial space on the ground floor and the library on the top floor, offering stunning views of the Grey River and the sea. A lift will provide easy access to the upper floor. The commercial spaces will increase activity at the complex and produce revenue that will help offset library operating costs and reduce long-term expenses.

Modern libraries, offering more than traditional books, serve as community hubs that enhance community participation and capability by providing access to various activities, technology, and meeting spaces. Our current library is highly utilised and popular among all age groups in our community and visitors. In planning our new library for Grey District, we've looked at other successful new libraries including Motueka, Blenheim, Selwyn, and Christchurch. These concepts have helped us to consider the possibilities for our new library. We look forward to engaging with you, gathering feedback, and ensuring that what we deliver meets the community's needs.

A range of events are planned for the upcoming festive season and I encourage everyone to keep up to date with these by visiting the Council website or Facebook page.

I wish you all a safe and happy summer season, making the most of the holiday period with your friends and family.

The Snap Send Solve app helps you to report things like dumped rubbish, footpath problems, water leaks and other issues in seconds.

There are just four simple steps:

- Take a picture of the issue 0 (this is optional)
- Confirm the location of the issue
- Select the type of issue (Snap, Send, Solve uses the location and type of issue to send the report to the correct authority).
- Fill out the details on the form and press "submit".

That's it. We'll get onto the issue and let you know what we've done.

What is Mayors Taskforce for Jobs?

The Mayors Taskforce for Jobs is a community employment programme that supports NEETS (young people aged 16-24 not in education, training or employment), people living with a disability or people who are disadvantaged in the workforce.

The programme has funding available to support the jobseeker to become work ready and offer support as they secure sustainable employment within the Grey District.

Our team will work with them to create a specific plan to support their goals and aspirations for their future. Each jobseekers situation is unique, so our team uses a tailored approach to suit each jobseekers situation.

What can Mayors Taskforce for Jobs offer?

Below are some examples where Mayors Taskforce for Jobs can support a jobseeker into employment;

- CV preparation
- · Purchasing their tools or equipment
- Purchasing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Covering the cost of any training and courses
- Offering travel and accommodation assistances
- Covering the cost of driver licensing
- Offering pastoral care support
- Offering a Wage Subsidy to the employer

WHY COMPOST?

Composting is a fantastic way to turn your kitchen and garden waste into nutrientrich goodness for your plants.

Green waste that may otherwise be taken to the landfill can instead be composted at home in your own backyard!



PICKING UP YOUR BIN

Compost bins are available to pick up from Council offices.

Our friendly staff will ask you to confirm your eligibility so please bring along your Gold Card or a valid form of ID, and your latest rates invoice if possible.

Forms of ID: Drivers Licence, Birth Certificate, Passport, 18+ card or Kiwi Access Card.

The compost bins are 240L. The bins require assembly and will be in a flat pack box. Full instructions are included, however if you are unable to assemble your bin at home or transport it, please let us know.

With your compost bin, you'll receive a composting guide with helpful tips and tricks to get you started on the right foot. Our website also has helpful information about composting, www.greydc.govt.nz/composting.

Liquor Licensing Close off dates 2023/24

The following deadlines apply for ALL liquor licencing applications, including special licence applications for Christmas, New Year's Eve and Waitangi Day:

 If your event date is between 20 December 2023 and 13 February 2024, you must make your application by 20 November 2023 at the latest, to ensure it can be processed and granted and issued to you before 20 December 2023.

Note: New Year's Eve comes on the same date every year. Late notice applications are unlikely to be accepted as the need for a special licence can be reasonably foreseen.

 If you have an event on or after 14 February 2024, the 18th of January 2024 is the very last day for submitting an application (so think about filing before 20 December 2023 because of our non-working day period from 20 December 2023 to 15 January 2024).

Waitangi Day 2024

 Because we do not count the days from 20 December 2023 to 15 January 2024 this also means that all special licence applications for Waitangi Day, 6 February 2024 must be received by 20 November 2023 at the latest.

We encourage you to apply early as this is our busiest period for processing applications.
