BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The Greymouth Rodders Inc. applies for a new Club Licence in respect of premises situated at 26-40 Cowper Street, Anzac Park known as the Greymouth Rodders Clubrooms.

The applicant holds a current Club Licence No55/CLUB/001/2020.

The main principal entrance is from the carpark in Anzac Park which leads to a set of stairs up to the balcony.

The application was duly notified on Council's website on 23 November 2021 and no objections were received from members of the public.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Greymouth Rodders Incorporated for a renewal of a Club Licence for the premises at the Greymouth Rodders Clubrooms, 26-40 Cowper Street, Greymouth subject to the following conditions.

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following day and hours:
 - a. Monday to Thursday 5pm to 10pm.
 - b. Friday 5pm to 12midnight
 - c. Saturday and Public Holidays - 12 noon to 12 midnight
 - d. Sunday 12 noon to 10pm

2. The premise area be classed as undesignated.
3. The Licensee must take all practicable steps to ensure that
 - a. There are at all times a secretary of the club, and
 - b. Within 10 working days from the appointment of a new secretary, the Secretary of the Grey District Licensing Committee is told the name of the new secretary, and
 - c. All proceeds from the sale of liquor belong to the club.
4. The licensee must ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied to any person from consumption on the premises unless the person is-
 - a. A member of the Club
 - b. Is on the premises at the invitation of and is accompanied by a member of the club.
 - c. An authorised visitor as per the meaning of the Act,
 - d. A person who is on the premises at the invitation of an authorised visitor who is also on the premises
 - e. No alcohol to be consumed outside of the premise area.
5. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed at the premises.
6. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licenced premises.
8. Drinking water is to be available free to patrons while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
9. Alcohol can be sold and supplied to quests of members of clubs with which the licensee has an arrangement for reciprocal vising rights for members.
10. At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available.
11. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non- alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages;
12. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - b. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.

13. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:

- a. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

14. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premises licensed area as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 17 November 2021. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Licensing Inspector advises the applicant has not come to the attention of the reporting agencies, nor have there been any complaints in the time they have been operating. He does not oppose the application.

The NZ Police and Medical Officer of Health have advised they do not oppose the application.

Grey District Council as landowner has no objections.

Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act.
