

Decision No. GREYDLC068/2019

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **RECREATION HOTEL LIMITED** for the renewal of an Off Licence pursuant to s.127 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 68 High Street, Greymouth known as "Liquorland Recreation"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

This is an application by Recreation Hotel Limited for the renewal of an Off Licence in respect of premises situated 72-74 High Street, Greymouth known as the "Recreation Hotel."

The business is that of a retail bottle store known as "Liquorland Recreation". This store is well established and follows the format of the company's other outlets.

The applicant seeks the following days and hours:

Sunday	11am to 7pm
Monday	10am to 9.30pm
Tuesday	10am to 9.30pm
Wednesday	10am to 10pm
Thursday	10am to 10pm
Friday	10am to 11pm
Saturday	11am to 11pm

The application was notified on the Council website on 23 May 2019 and no objections were received from the public.

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health have raised any matters in opposition to this application.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Recreation Hotel Limited for the renewal of an off licence in respect of premises situated at 72-74 High Street, Greymouth and subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:

Sunday	11am to 7pm
Monday	10am to 9.30pm
Tuesday	10am to 9.30pm
Wednesday	10am to 10pm
Thursday	10am to 10pm
Friday	10am to 11pm
Saturday	11am to 11pm

2. No alcohol is to be sold on, or delivered from, the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday or Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
3. While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at the place where the samples are being supplied.
4. The whole of the off licence premises is designated as a supervised area;
5. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
6. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance.
7. The licence is subject to the payment of licence fees as required by the Sales and Alcohol (fees) Regulations 2013.

The premises are as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 2 May 2019. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The application is complete and contains all supporting documents as required under s.127 of the Act. It was duly advertised and no objection, opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

The premises have been previously licenced with the same licence hours. The principle business carried on upon the premise is that of a bottle store/over the bar off sales and therefore the premises are of a kind for which an off licence may be granted under section 32. The principle entrance is located off the road and footpath to the south side of the building at 68 High Street, Greymouth.

Neither the New Zealand Police nor the Licensing Inspector express any concern about the suitability of the applicant nor do they oppose the granting of the application. No undertakings are sought by the agencies.


Accordingly the application is dealt with on the papers.

The Inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area have not been adversely affected by more

There are no issues with the design and layout of the premises in regarding to minimising potential harm and/or ensuring a safe environment for patrons.

Grey District Council does not have a current LAP and the hours applied for are in line with the default hours as set by the Act.
