

Decision No. GREYDLC094/2020

of an application by **HIGH STREET GROCER LIMITED** pursuant to s.127 of the Act for the renewal of an Off Licence in respect of premises situated at 124-128 High Street, Greymouth known as "Henry's Beer Wine & Spirits Greymouth"

**BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE**

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, approves an application by High Street Grocer Limited for a renewal of an Off Licence pursuant to s.100 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, in respect of premises situated at 128 High Street, Greymouth known as "Henry's Beer Wines & Spirits, Greymouth",

**REASONS FOR THE DECISION**

The application was duly notified on the Council website from 12 August 2020, the last day for public objections was 03 September 2020 and did not attract any public objection.

A report on the application was received from the Inspector, noting that the Police and Medical Officer of Health had no objections to this application.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the Applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements or intention of the Act.

Overall I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 and s.132 of the Act.

Pursuant to s.134 of the Act I deal with the matter on the papers.

Accordingly I renew the Applicant's Off Licence upon the conditions, days and hours set out below:

## CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

1. Alcohol may be sold from the bottle store for consumption off the premises between on the following days and during the following hours:
  - a. **Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Sunday**  
**Hours: 11am to 9pm**
  - b. **Saturday**  
**Hours: 9am to 9pm**
2. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
3. The premise area is to be designated as supervised.
4. When free samples of alcohol are being provided, the licensee must provide and promote free drinking water.
5. A certified Manager is on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
6. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
  - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
  - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
  - c. The Licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailed restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
7. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
  - a. A sign at each principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol.
  - b. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premise.
  - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty when alcohol is for sale.

The Premises licensed area is set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 12 August 2020. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

The renewal will be for three years from the expiry of the current licence and a replacement licence is to be issued.
