

Decision No. GREYDLC049/2019

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **UNION HOTEL (2013) LIMITED** for the renewal of an On Licence pursuant to s.100 and s.120 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 20 Herbert Street, Greymouth known as the "Union Hotel"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

This is an application by Union Hotel (2013) Limited for the renewal of an On Licence situated at 20 Herbert Street, Greymouth known as the Union Hotel.

The general nature of the business is that of a Restaurant and Bar with applied licensed hours of Monday to Sunday 8am to 3am.

The principal entrance to the premises is the entrance from the front door from Herbert Street, Greymouth

This application was duly notified on Council website and no objections were received from members of the public.

The Hotel is located within the main CBD area and is zoned commercial.

Neither the Police nor the Medical Officer of Health has any matters in opposition.

The committee is satisfied as to the matters that it must have regard to as set out in sections 105,106 and 131 of the Act and the committee.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The business carried on upon the premise is that of a hotel and restaurant therefore the premises are of a kind for which an on-licence may be granted. The principle entrance is off Herbert Street, Greymouth.

The inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been adversely affected and that the applicant has sound host responsibility practices.

Neither the Medical Officer of Health, Police nor the Licensing Inspector expressed any concern about the suitability of the applicant nor have any of the agencies opposed the granting of the application. No undertakings are sought by the agencies.

Grey District Council does not have a current LAP and the hours agreed on are in line with the default hours as set by the Act.

The committee is satisfied as to the matters that it must have regard to as set out in sections 4, 105,106 and 131 of the Act.

The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 sets out the considerations which must be taken by the District Licensing Committee, when considering any application for a licence to sell alcohol.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements of the Act.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, approves an application by Union Hotel (2013) Limited for a new ON licence for the premises at 20 Herbert Street, Greymouth known subject to conditions.

The premises are as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 8 April 2019. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

1. Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
 - a. Monday to Sunday 8am to 3am the following day (8am to 12 midnight on the Thursday before Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve and the day before Anzac Day) to any other person who is present on the premises.
 - b. At any time on any day to any person who is for the time being living on the premises.
2. No liquor is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are:
 - a. For the time being living on the premises whether as a lodger or an employee of the licensee or otherwise, or
 - b. Present on the premises for the purpose of dining.
3. The following premises as per plan supplied are designated as follows:
 - a. Bar Areas – Supervised
 - b. Outside Areas – Supervised
 - c. Carvery and Copper Room – Undesignated
 - d. Gaming Area - Restricted
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol a reasonable range

of non-alcoholic refreshments. Water is to be provided freely at no cost to patrons from either a water supply prominently situated on the premises, across the bar and in the restaurant.

5. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol, in accordance with the example menu submitted with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
7. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
8. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
 - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
9. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
 - d. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by which name the manager for the time being on duty.
10. The licence is subject to the payment of licence fees as required by the Sales and Alcohol (fees) Regulations 2013.
