

Decision No. GREYDLC100/2020

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **HOPAHOLICS BREWERY LIMITED** for a new On Licence pursuant to s.100 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 25-29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as "Hopaholics Taproom"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

This is an application by Hopaholics Brewery Limited for an On Licence situated at 29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as "Hopaholics Taproom".

The applicant is a private company incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 5 March 2019.

The general nature of the business is a small café and bar which will specialise in tastings with applied licensed hours of Monday to Sunday 8:00am to 2:00 am the following day.

The principal entrance to the premises is the entrance from the front door from Boundary Street, Greymouth.

This application was duly notified on Council website on 1 September 2020 and no objections were received from members of the public.

The applicant has provided a detailed menu of the options with low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments being available.

Having considered the application, the application for a new on-licence is granted, on the conditions set out below, for the reasons set out in this decision.

An application for an Off Licence has also been applied for this premise.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant is described in the Inspectors report as a company with the directors and shareholder being Sarah Jane Johnson and Jason Edward Colin Johnson, both have been involved in the alcohol industry since 2018, having operated and managed a current off licence for Hopaholics Brewery situated at 51 Stuart & Chapman Drive, Greymouth. The Inspector believes the applicant company is suitable to operate another licenced premise.

The Inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been adversely affected and that the applicant has sound host responsibility practices.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

A Certificate of Compliance has been sought and issued for this activity.

The restaurant and bar is zoned commercial. Approval for the businesses nature was sought and given by the Landlord.

The floor plan shows the layout of the premises. All of the premise area is undesignated.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements of the Act.

Overall I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and s.106 of the Act.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, approves an application by Hopaholics Brewery Limited for a new ON licence for the premises at 29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as Hopaholics Taprooms subject to conditions.

The premises are as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 1 September 2020. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 8:00 am to 2:00 am the following morning


2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1:00 pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are present to dine on the premises.
3. The whole of the premise is designated as an undesignated area.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
5. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.

6. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol, in accordance with the example menu submitted with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
8. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
9. Advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport is available to patrons from the licensed premises.
10. Other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
 - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - c. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
11. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - a. A sign at the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open to sale of alcohol.
 - b. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

The licence will be in force for 12 months from the date of issue.
