

Decision No. GREYDLC127/2020

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **DUNOLLIE HOTEL 2019 LIMITED** for the renewal of an On Licence pursuant to s 127 of the Act in respect of premises situated at the 37 MacDougall Avenue, Dunollie, known as the "Dunollie Hotel"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The application by Dunollie Hotel 2019 Limited in respect of premises situated at 37 MacDougall Avenue, Dunollie, known as the "Dunollie Hotel".

The general nature of the business is that of a hotel and restaurant. The applied licensed hours are Monday to Sunday 11am to 1am the following morning.

The principal entrance to the premises is the entrance is from the door that leads onto Argyle Street, Dunollie.

The applicants have provided a detailed menu of the options they sell and low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments are available.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

This is an application by the Dunollie Hotel Limited 2019 for the renewal of an On Licence situated at 37 MacDougall Ave Dunollie, known as the "Dunollie Hotel".

The application was notified on council's website on the 6 October 2020 and no objections were received from members of the public.

The Committee has received a report on the application from the Grey District Council Inspector with no objections. There were no objections received from the Police or Medical Officer of Health.

Accordingly I will deal with the matter on the papers.

The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 sets out the considerations which must be taken by the District Licensing Committee, when considering any application for a licence to sell alcohol.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements of the Act.

The Committee is satisfied that after reviewing the application with respect to the section 105 considerations, that the application for a renewal on-licence should be approved.

Overall I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in section 131 and 132 of the Act.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Dunollie Hotel Limited for a renewal of an On Licence in respect of premises situated at 37 MacDougall Ave, Dunollie and subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

1. Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 11am to 1am the following day.
 - a. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are
 - i. present on the premises for the purpose of dining; or
 - ii. Residing or lodging on the premises
2. The Licensee to ensure that the Licence to Occupy for the deck area is current at all times.
3. The bar area is designated as supervised with other licensed areas undesignated and restricted as per the plan supplied.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments. Water is to be provided freely at no cost to patrons from either a water supply prominently situated on the premises or from across the bar.
5. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol, in accordance with the example menu submitted with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
7. A properly certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premise are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.

8. Signage for alternative forms of transport to be displayed with staff to assist patrons with arranging transport.
9. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
 - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - c. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
10. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - a. A sign at the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open to sale of alcohol.
 - b. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by which name the manager for the time being on duty.
11. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The premises are set out on the plan submitted with the application, dated stamped 6 October 2020.
