

Decision No. GREYDLC 051/2021

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **SARAH ANNE HAMMOND** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 47 Ahau Street, Moana with the premises known as the "St Johns Church".

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

Sarah Anne Hammond has made an application for a special licence for a Fundraiser to restore the Moana Church. The event is called "The Bash at the Bishops Bach" on Saturday 5th June 2021.

This application is for an On-site Special Licence as per Section 22(5) of the Act.

The premises is known as the St Johns Church situated at 47 Ahau Street, Moana and the applicant has approval to use the church for the function. The main principal entranceway is from Ahau Street, Moana.

The applicant seeks to sell and supply bottled Beer and low alcohol beer in BYO vessels, only standard drink sizes will be served. This is a ticked event with a maximum of 60 Tickets.

Estimated number anticipated will be approximately 100 people with probable age distribution of 18-80 years old.

The date and hours being applied for are:

Saturday 5 th June	The Bash at the Bishops Batch	7pm to 12 midnight
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Section 149(2) notes if a special licence issued is postponed to some other day, the licence is in force on the day on which the event or part takes place.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by the Sarah Anne Hammond for an on-site Special Licence for the premises at 47 Ahau Street, Moana for a fundraising event subject to the following conditions:

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days during following hours.

Saturday 5 th June	The Bash at the Bishops Batch	7pm to 12 midnight
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2. The premises be classed as Restricted for the licence period and is shown on the plan attached to this licence.
3. A certified duty manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
4. The licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point of sale detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcoholic beverages.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises.
7. Drinking water is to be provided free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
8. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licenced premises.
9. Noise levels are to be monitored at all times.
10. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The premises licensed area is set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 6 May 2021. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has undertaken in their application to provide the following measures with regard to responsible sales or supply of alcohol and that harm will be minimised:

- Food being, Platters, savouries and Cakes etc. will be available during the event.

- Free water will be available at no charge throughout the events from the bar area.
- Non-alcoholic and low alcoholic beverages will be available.
- A sober driver is available.

The Inspector's report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent, noise is to be monitored by members throughout the events. The Inspector does not oppose this application.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition

The applicant has previously held events with a Special Licence and no complaints have been received.

It is noted that the named duty manager, Sarah Hammond will renew her Managers Certificate which expires on 28 May 2021.

Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.
