IN THE MATTER

of an application by **ANTHONY GRAHAM WILLIAMS** for the renewal of an On Licence pursuant to s127 of the Act in respect of premises situated at the 74 Tasman Street Greymouth, known as "The Ashley Hotel"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

Anthony Graham Williams has applied for the renewal of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 74 Tasman Street, Greymouth, known as the "Ashley Hotel".

The general nature of the business is hotel with a bar and restaurant.

The principal entrance way is from 74 Tasman Street, Greymouth.

The business is zoned on commercial land in the Grey District Plan with both neighbouring businesses and residential homes on residential land.

The floor plan submitted with the application shows the bar area which is designated supervised and the restaurant area designated undesignated.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **grants** an application by Anthony Graham Williams for the renewal of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at 74 Tasman Street, Greymouth known as the Ashley Hotel.

CONDITIONS:

The licence is subject to the conditions listed below:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:
 - **Monday to Sunday 8am to 3am the following day.**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.

3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
5. The bar premises is designated as a Supervised Area with the restaurant being classed as undesignated.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
7. A certificated, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
8. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
9. `The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale or alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

The premise licence area is as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 17 August 2021. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has operated this business compliantly for a number of years and is an experienced licensee.

The applicant has provided a detailed menu of the food options they sell and the low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments that are available.

The applicant has made provision for the supply of free water at the bar and via table service

The inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been adversely affected and that the applicant has sound host responsibility practices. She does not oppose the application.


The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.
