

Decision No. GREYDLC 099/2021

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **THE EXPERIENCE COLLECTIVE** trading as Monteith Brewing Company for the renewal of an On Licence pursuant to s127 of the Act in respect of premises 60-74 Herbert Street, Greymouth, known as "Monteith's Brewery"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The application is by The Experience Collective in respect of premises situated at 60-74 Herbert Street, Greymouth known as "Monteith's Brewery".

This is a Private Company Inc on the 4 July 2016 No 6039332. The Directors and Shareholders are Nick and Rosie Rogers who are experienced licences who have been involved in the industry for 5 years.

The applicants hold a current On Licence number 55/ON/78/2017.

This application was duly notified on Council website where no objections were received from members of the public

The principle entrance is off Herbert Street, Greymouth.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **grants** an application by Monteith's Brewing Company for a renewal of the ON Licence in respect of premises situated at the corner 60-74 Herbert Streets, Greymouth known as "Monteith's Brewery" subject to conditions.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

The licence is subject to the conditions listed below:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 8am to 1am the following day

2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are present on the premises for the purpose of dining.
3. The whole of the premises is designated as undesignated.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
5. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
6. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol, in accordance with the example menu submitted with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
8. A properly appointed certified, or Acting or Temporary, manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
9. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
10. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
 - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - c. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
11. The licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - a. A sign at the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open to sale of alcohol.
 - b. A copy of the licence, conditions of the licence, and plan of the licensed area attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has been operating for 5 years and have not come to the notice of the reporting agencies.

The application was advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.


The Committee has received a report on the application from the Grey District Council Liquor Inspector with no objections.

There were no objections received from the Police or Medical Officer of Health and no undertakings are sought by the agencies.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements of the Act.

I am satisfied that after reviewing the application with respect to the sections 105 and 106 of the Act, that the application for a renewal on-licence should be approved.
