

Decision No. GREYDLC 120/2021

**IN THE MATTER**

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

**AND**

**IN THE MATTER**

of an application by **EDGE OF THE ALPS LIMITED** trading as Woodstock Brewing Greymouth Grill for the renewal of an On Licence pursuant to s.127 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 25-29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as "Woodstock Grill"

**BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE**

This is an application by Edge of the Alps Limited for a renewal of an On Licence situated at 25-29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as Woodstock Brewing Greymouth Grill.

The applicant is a private company incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 31 July 2020. The directors and shareholders are Jessica Lee Travis and Anthony John Travis.

The applicants hold a current On Licence Number 55/ON/004/2020.

The general nature of the business is that of a Restaurant and Bar.

The principal entrance to the premises is the entrance from the front door on the corner of Boundary Street and Mackay Street.

**DECISION**

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **grants** an application by Edge of the Alps Limited for a renewal of the ON licence for the premises at 25-29 Boundary Street, Greymouth known as Woodstock Brewing Greymouth Grill subject to conditions.

**CONDITIONS OF LICENCE**

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and during the following hours:

**Monday to Sunday 8am to 1am the following day**

2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are present on the premise for to dine on the premises.
3. The whole of the premise is designated as an undesignated area.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
5. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
6. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol, in accordance with the example menu submitted with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
8. A properly appointed certified or acting or temporary manager must be on duty at all times, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
9. Advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport is available to patrons from the licensed premises.
10. Other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
  - a. All service staff must be trained in their responsibilities under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
  - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
  - c. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
11. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
  - a. A sign at the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open to sale of alcohol.
  - b. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

**The premises are as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 6 September 2021. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.**

### REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has been operating for the current year and has not come to the notice of the reporting agencies.

The restaurant and bar is zoned commercial with approval being sought and given by the Landlord.

The Inspector reports that the amenity and good order of the area has not been adversely affected and that the applicant has sound host responsibility practices.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

This application was duly notified on Council website on 6 September 2021 and no objections were received from members of the public.

Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

There is no evidence before the Committee which would suggest that the applicant would manage the premises in any way which would contravene the requirements of the Act.

Overall I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and s.106 of the Act.
