

Decision No. GREYDLC082/2019

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **GREYMOUTH RODDERS INCORPORATED** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated 26-40 Cowper Street, Greymouth known as the "Greymouth Rodders Clubrooms"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The Greymouth Rodders Inc. applies for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at the Greymouth Rodders Clubrooms.

The event is a 60th birthday party and it is anticipated that there will be up to approximately 100 people attending.

The applicant has provided sufficient information to demonstrate that suitable measures will be undertaken with regard to responsible sales or supply of alcohol and that the possibility of alcohol related harm will be minimised.

Food options include nibbles and a continuous supper from 9pm onwards. Low and non-alcoholic drinks will be available throughout the night. Fresh drinking water will be provided at all times with signage advertising the location of this water being displayed.

The day and hours being sought for the event – Saturday 31 August 2019 7pm to 1am the following morning.

The main principle entranceway is known as Anzac park 26-40 Cowper Street, Greymouth.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Greymouth Rodders Incorporated for a Special Licence for the premises at the Greymouth Rodders Clubrooms, 26-40 Cowper Street, Greymouth subject to the following conditions.

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following day and hours – Saturday 31 August 2019 7pm to 1am the following morning.
2. The premises be classed as undesignated for the licence period.
3. No alcohol to be consumed outside of the premise area.
4. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed at the premises.
5. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
6. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licenced premises.
7. Drinking water is to be available free to patrons while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
8. At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available.
9. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages;
10. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - a. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - b. The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
11. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - a. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
12. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premises licensed area as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 26 July 2019. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The event is being held in the local clubrooms with no immediate neighbours.

The Inspector's report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

The Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

On that basis I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.
