

Decision No. GREYDLC107/2019

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by the **KARORO BOWLING CLUB** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at corner of Nelson and Shelley Streets, Greymouth known as the "Karoro Bowling Club"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The Karoro Bowling club has made application for a special licence to sell and supply alcohol to cover three specific events in the club.

The proposed event and hours applied for are as follows:

Saturday 23 November 2019	4pm to midnight	60 th Birthday party

Premise is designated that of an undesignated area.

Further explanation of the events are in the Inspectors detailed report and sufficient for the committee to not have to comment further.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 grants an application by the Karoro Bowling Club for an on-site Special Licence for the premises at the corner of Shelley and Nelson Streets, Greymouth known as the Karoro Bowling Club, for the following event subject to the following conditions:

Conditions:

The events and hours applied for are to be as follows:

Saturday 23 November 2019	4pm to midnight	60 th Birthday party
---------------------------	-----------------	---------------------------------

1. Drinking water must be freely available at no charge to patrons.
2. Food as listed by the applicant to be available on the premises on each occasion this licence is operated.
3. Low and non-alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply from the bar at all times.
4. Noise levels to be monitored at all times by the duty manager.
5. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed at the premises.
6. Assistance to be provided on alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
7. The whole of the premises is designated as undesignated.
8. The principle entrance being the rear foyer area is designated as the principle entrance to the premises;
9. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed: minors and intoxicated person must not be served alcohol.
10. The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
11. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premises licence area as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 18 September 2019. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant has previously operated Special Licences and has undertaken in their application to provide measures with regard to responsible sales or supply of alcohol and that harm will be minimised.

I am satisfied that the applicant has sufficient staff and adequate training to manage these events safely and in accordance with the Act.

The Inspector's report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The reports of the Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

Provision for food has been made and is described as BBQ meat, sandwiches, savouries and desserts

The sale and consumption of alcohol will be monitored and anyone showing signs of intoxication will not be served.

Low and non-alcoholic drinks are available throughout the evening.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and s.142 of the Act.
