

Decision No. GREYDLC014/2020

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **CARDRONA LIMITED** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at the situated at 1946 Kumara Inchbonnie Road, Mitchells, Kumara known as the "Lake Brunner Lodge"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

Cardrona Limited has made application for a special licence to sell and supply alcohol for an event called the "Lake Brunner Music Festival" being held on Saturday 29 February 2020.

The event is being described as a music festival with proposed hours of 12noon to 10pm.

The main principle entrance is from 1950 Kumara-Inchbonnie Road.

Estimated number anticipated will be approximately up to 200 people with probable age distribution of 30- 60 years old.

The event is being held on lodge grounds that are not covered for the On Licence of the Lake Brunner Lodge and will run until 10pm whereupon the on licence is to 3am.

The music being played outside and there are no immediate neighbours however the noise will be monitored by staff

Accommodation is the lodge with camping on site also available.

The whole of the premises is designated as an undesignated area. This is outside to the back and side of the lodge as shown on the plan provided.

A sample menu has been provided with the application.

Tickets will be pre sold up to a maximum of 200. All attendees will be wearing wristbands.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairman, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Cardrona Limited known as the "Lake Brunner Lodge" for a Special Licence for the premises at the at 1946 Kumara Inchbonnie, for an event subject to the following conditions:

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following day and during the following hours:

Saturday 29 February 2020

Hours: 12noon to 10pm

2. The premises be classed as undesignated for the licence period.
3. No alcohol to be consumed outside of designated area as per plan supplied.
4. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed at the premises.
5. All bottles served to be opened on purchase by bar staff.
6. Sale of alcohol is limited to four units per person but this may be further reduced at any time if directed to do so by a committee member or Police.
7. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed: minors and intoxicated person must not be served alcohol.
8. Drinking water must be freely available at no charge at all times.
9. Food must be available for consumption on the premises.
10. Low and non-alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply from the bar.
11. Courtesy vehicle to be available on request with advice and assistance on alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
12. Noise levels to be monitored at all times.
13. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premises area as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 13 January 2020. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The applicant committee has a current ON Licence No. 55/ON/15/2014 recently renewed on 8 February 2018 for the hours of 8am to 3am.

I am satisfied that the applicant has sufficient staff and adequate training to manage these events safely and in accordance with the Act.

The Inspectors report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The reports of the Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

A report from the Grey District Licensing Inspector advised he does not oppose the application.

The Inspector has reported that the certified bar manager is experienced and the committee expect that any bar staff are fully trained for this event. The applicant has advised that three duty managers will be onsite throughout the event along with security.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

Food as per menu supplied will be provided with two water stations outside and one inside the lodge.

This event has been held previously without any problems coming to the attention of the reporting agents.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.
