

Decision No. GREYDLC122/2020

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **LEISA MARIE WILLIAMS** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for an offsite Special Licence in respect of premises situated at Westurf Recreation Ground, Greymouth Coast"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

Leisa Marie Williams has made application for a special licence for a Fundraiser for the Hokitika Hockey Club to sell and supply alcohol at an event called "SI Masters Hockey Tournament" on 7 November 2020.

This application is for an On-site Special Licence as per Section 22(5) of the Act.

The applicant seeks to sell and supply bottled Beer and low alcohol beer in 330ml bottles.

Estimated number anticipated will be approximately 100 people with probable age distribution of 34-70 years old.

The event is being held on the Westurf Recreation Ground at 84a Shakespeare Street, Greymouth.

Both the Lessee (Westurf Recreation Trust) and the Landowner (Grey District Council) advise that they have no objection to this application.

The premises area of 6 x 4m will be fenced with 1100m high waratahs with netting over the top and is designated as restricted.

Food will be available is of a BBQ Style, Bacon Butties, Meat Patties, Sausage Sizzle, Muffins and Cake.

The premises are within a liquor ban area.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by Leisa Marie Williams for a Special Licence for the "SI Masters Hockey Tournament", subject to the following conditions:

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following day and during the following hours:

Saturday 7th November 2020

Hours: 2pm to 7pm

2. The fenced area be classed as restricted for the licence period.
3. No alcohol to be consumed outside of the premise area.
4. A Certified Manager must be present on the premises for the duration of the event.
5. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. A copy of the licence attached to the premises to be easily read by people entering each principle entrance to the premises.
 - b. A sign prominently displayed at the premises which identifies by name the manager on duty.
 - c. Signage detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
6. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - a. Minors and intoxicated persons must not be served or sold alcohol.
 - b. Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
7. Drinking water must always be freely available at no charge.
8. A phone be available for ordering alternative Transport as required, signage advising of this and the telephone number of local taxi firm be displayed.
9. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Inspectors report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The Licensing Inspector advised that the applicant has the appropriate systems and training to comply with the law and she does not oppose the application.


The Police and Medical Officer of Health do not oppose the application.

The area within the premises of the Westurf Recreation Ground are described as restricted for the duration of the event on the Saturday 7th November 2020.
