

Decision No. GREYDLC156/2020

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **GREYMOUTH GOLF CLUB INCORPORATED** pursuant to s.138 of the Act for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 113 Golf Links road, Kaiata known as the "Greymouth Golf Club"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The Greymouth Golf Club Incorporated has applied for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 113 Golf Links Road, Kaiata known as the "Greymouth Golf Club".

The Premises hold a Club Licence No. 055/CLUB/87/2015 issued on the 26 September 2018 expiring on 2 August 2021. The hours of the licence are currently 3pm to 10pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 12 midnight Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays.

The application as submitted an application for a special licence to sell and supply alcohol for the following events.

Friday 12 February 2021	West Coast Classic Golf Tournament	12 noon to 10pm
Saturday 13 February and 2021	West Coast Classic Golf tournament	9am to Midnight
Sunday 14 February 2021	West Coast Classic Golf tournament	9am to 10am
Friday 5 March 2021	West Coast Golf Challenge	9am to 10pm

The first event is by entry only and has an estimated Number of around 140 people, the second event is also limited to 120 players attending with the probable age distribution for both events of people being 25 – 80 years old.

This main entrance is on the east side of the building at 113 Golf Links Road, Kaiata.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

This is the applicant's first Special Licence and has undertaken in their application to provide the following measures with regard to responsible sales or supply of alcohol and that harm will be minimised.

- Food will be supplied will be available as per menu supplied with the application.
- free water will be available at no charge throughout the events from the bar.
- Non and Low alcoholic beverages available for sale

I am satisfied that the applicant has sufficient staff and adequate training to manage these events safely and in accordance with the Act.

Committee members will be in attendance.

A courtesy coach will also be available throughout the events.

The Inspector's report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 approves an application by the Greymouth Golf Club for a Special Licence in respect of premises 113 Golf Links Road, Kaiata Greymouth known as the "Greymouth Golf Club" subject to conditions.

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the following days and hours:

Friday 12 February 2021	West Coast Classic Golf Tournament	12 noon to 10pm
Saturday 13 February and 2021	West Coast Classic Golf Tournament	9am to Midnight
Sunday 14 February 2021	West Coast Classic Golf Tournament	9am to 10am
Friday 5 March 2021	West Coast Golf Challenge	9am to 10pm

2. The license area as per plan provided are designated as undesignated including a small area outside near the putting green.
3. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed: minors and intoxicated person must not be served alcohol.
4. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at all times.

5. Food as listed by the applicant to be available on the premises during the licence hours.
6. Low and non-alcoholic beverages must be available for sale and supply from the bar at all times.
7. Signage for alternative form of transport to be displayed with staff to assist patrons with arranging transport.
8. The holder of the Managers certificate shall be on duty and on the premises at all times during the licence hours.
9. The following other steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - Evidence of age documents will be requested where appropriate.
 - The Licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons are observed, and signage displayed detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
10. The Licensee must ensure the following items are prominently displayed:
 - A sign at the premises, so as to be easily read by patrons, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open to sale of alcohol.
 - A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
 - A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by which name the manager for the time being on duty.
11. The licence is subject to the payment of licence fees as required by the Sales and Alcohol (fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premise area as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 11 December 2020. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.
