

Decision No. GREYDLC 027/2021

IN THE MATTER

of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER

of an application by **DAVID JOHN KENNEDY** trading as Brunnerton Lodge pursuant to s.138 of the Act for a Special Licence in respect of premises situated at 745 Taylorville road, Taylorville known as "Brunnerton Lodge"

BEFORE THE GREY DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

David John Kennedy (trading as Brunnerton Lodge) has made application for a special licence to sell and supply alcohol in respect of premises situated at 745 Taylorville Road, Taylorville known as "Brunnerton Lodge".

The 12 events are being described as intended to provide a "quintessential kiwi experience by providing local beer, wine, food and entertainment with a safe family environment for residents of Taylorville and the surrounding area."

The licence hours applied for are 12 midday to 10.30pm on the following dates:

The whole of the premises is designated as an undesignated area.

It is anticipated that there will be approximately less than 100 people attending each of the events.

There will be food and transport available as per menu supplied with the application

DECISION

The Grey District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **grants** an application by David John Kennedy trading as Brunnerton Lodge for a Special Licence for the premises situated at 745 Taylorville Road, Taylorville, for 12 events subject to the following conditions:

Conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the hours of **12 noon to 10.30pm**:

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2. The premises be classed as undesignated for the licence period and includes an indoor beer and outdoor beer garden as per plan provided.
3. The licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point of sale detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
4. We note that this application has only noted the one certified duty manager that being Janice Daphne Flinn who is an experienced manager.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
6. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.

8. The licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
9. A courtesy Van is available.
10. Payment of the fee prescribed under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol (Fees) Regulations 2013.

The Premises area is as set out on the plan submitted with the application and date stamped 16 February 2021. A note to this effect is to be made on the licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Inspectors report indicates that the amenity and good order of the locality will not be adversely affected by more than a minor extent.

The reports of the Police and Medical Officer of Health raise no matters in opposition.

A report from the Grey District Licensing Inspector advised she does not oppose the application.

In the Inspectors report it has been recorded that the expected numbers attending these 12 x Small events will be less than 100 people.

The application was not required to be publicly notified and no opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly, I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.
