WESTLAND RECREATION CENTRE

Work has started on the new Westland Recreation Centre, a stage two development to the Grey District Aquatic Centre.

The new centre will replace the current ageing single court Civic Centre and provide our community with a new multi-purpose indoor stadium. It will have a double basketball sized court space, fitness centre, aerobics/activity/meeting space, a base for Sport West Coast and other codes and related indoor sport and community facilities.

Funding for the new stadium was kicked off with a Government grant of \$3.5 million to the Grey District community following the tragic events at the

Pike River mine in November 2010 in which 29 men lost their lives. After much consideration, Council decided to use the Government grant towards a much needed new indoor community recreation facility for the District.

The centre has been designed to address sport and recreation, health and wellbeing, education and training, civil defence, community and economic development needs. Once completed, it will also provide a valuable asset for our District's young people. As well as this, with its large court spaces and amenities, the centre will provide a welfare base and back-stop communication centre in the event of a civil emergency.

The initial cost estimate for the new centre was around \$10-11 million. Council worked hard to fine tune the budget to accommodate the needs of our community in the most financially efficient manner and the final estimated cost is just over \$11 million. Council has had a tremendous response from funding partners, sponsors, gaming and other trusts and has been successful in raising the total amount required to meet design and construction costs.

The facility is expected to be operational in mid to late 2016.

Mayor's Comment



The funding for the new Westland Recreation Centre is now in place.

It has taken four years to fundraise the \$11 million needed to relocate the Scouts and Girl Guides, reconfigure the croquet greens, reposition the

croquet clubrooms and build the stadium with gymnasium, including new parking and entry for hockey turf.

Together with the \$11 million Aquatic Centre, the region will have a sports hub as good as any in New Zealand.

Most regions have used ratepayer funding totalling 70% of the building cost for a new stadium. In our case, only 8% direct funding

is needed with zero direct rating for the new stadium. Only \$1.5 million of the \$22 million total cost of the stadium and Aquatic Centre was direct ratepayer funded.

It has taken ten years to raise the money for both projects and together with other belt tightening has enabled the Grey District to move from the highest rates on the West Coast to now being the lowest rates charged on the Coast and we are under the average charged New Zealand wide. Believe me, it's not easy raising funds since the recession of 2008 but fundraising is not rocket science; it is continually making contacts and forming relationships with generous sponsors and organisations, about just being a squeaky wheel that gets the oil.

When we built the Aquatic Centre, many firms and individuals from the Grey District

volunteered time and money, which also created a great community spirt by working together building a complex that will serve many generations to come.

The Westland Recretation Centre will be built to Earthquake IL4 strength standard, which is the highest post-disaster strength resistance so will be used as an emergency welfare centre when needed. CYB Construction Limited has won the tender and the 60 week construction project has begun.

Thanks to everyone involved in making the complex a reality. I am looking forward to a sports hub that Coasters will be proud of.

GREYMOUTH CBD RENEWAL PROJECT

VIRTUAL COOK STRAIT SWIM

The Grey District Aquatic Centre held a Virtual Cook Strait Swim in April, with all monies raised going direct to charity. The challenge was for each team to swim 29km, the distance of the Cook Strait (this is equivalent to 1,185 lengths of the pool).

Eight generous businesses (Crawford Refrigeration, Greymouth Seaside Top 10 Holiday Park, Mitre 10, Property Brokers, Scenicland Laundry, Subway, Smiths City and Recreation Hotel) sponsored the following charities and their teams: Blue Penguin Trust, Breast Cancer Cure, St Johns, Life Education Trust, Cancer Society, SPCA, Surf Life Saving and Coast Guard.

While it wasn't a race, there was definitely some good competition between the eight teams. First to complete the Strait was Breast Cancer Cure in a time of 1 hour 23 mins. The furthest individual swim was by Warren Gilbertson, who swum 320 lengths (8km). Collectively the 105 participants, ranging in age from 6 years to 70 plus years, swum over 8,500 lengths.

Many thanks to everyone who organised and participated in this amazing event. The District is lucky to have a high class facility like the Aquatic Cetnre which could accommodate this event and the organisers are looking forward to doing it again in the future.

DOG REGISTRATION

All dogs in the Grey District over the age of three months must be registered and all dogs first registered after 1 July 2006 need to be microchipped. Other dogs which must be microchipped include dogs classified as dangerous or menacing as well as dogs impounded as unregistered or dogs impounded more than once.

The annual dog registration time is coming up again and we'll be sending out registration notices to known owners around the end of June, with payment being due by 31 July. If you don't pay

your registration by the due date, you could be liable for a 50% penalty on your registration as well as a \$300 infringement for having an unregistered dog.



HUSBAND AND WIFE MANAGEMENT SUCCESS

"We have a very loyal base that attend the movies and we want to build on this. It's great to see so many new faces, especially those that have not attended for years; the best thing is when you see them back the following week."


Their focus now moves to the main auditorium where there are some exciting projects in the pipeline.
